





What's a Geopark?

A geopark is a type of natural park that includes elements of geological heritage from which we can learn about the Earth's history, including nature such as the inhabiting plants and animals, and other objects of archaeological and cultural value. The Hakusan Tedorigawa Geopark was registered as a Japanese Geopark in 2011, with the Tedori River area the centerstage of its themes, "Journey of Water" and "Journey of Rock." It is now attracting attention in its bid





This is the only studio that continues to produce Kaga gampi paper, a craft that has been handed down since the Edo period (1603-1868). Kaga gampi paper is a type of Japanese paper made from the fiber of the gampi plant, a wild shrub indigenous to Yamanaka and elsewhere in Kaga. The paper is thin but strong with a satin-like sheen. It used to be used for making gold and silver leaf.
